What?

The Northern Dimension Partnership in Public Health and Social Well-being.

When?

Founded 27 October 2003 in Oslo, Norway.

Why?

To tackle challenges in health and social well-being, and to generally improve people's quality of life in the Northern Dimension area.

Where?

The Northern Dimension area encompasses the territory from the European Arctic and Sub-Arctic to the southern shores of the Baltic Sea, as well as northwest Russia to the east and Iceland and Greenland to the west (see the map).

By intensifying cooperation, assisting the Partners and Participant in capacity building and enhancing coordination between international activities in the region.


