Business Kolding, the business development agency of Kolding started this new Park project called Nordic Synergy Park. The concept is the result of collaboration between Business Kolding, Scion DTU and Sophia Antipolis in France, as well as the Region of Southern Denmark and the Municipality of Kolding. Upon completion is planned to cover a surface of 15 square kilometres and should generate 30,000 jobs.
