#### 1. Registration and payments

#### 2. Getting to Tampere

by air

There are frequent daily flights between Helsinki-Vantaa Airport (HEL), and Tampere-Pirkkala Airport (TMP) the flight time being 30 minutes. There are also direct flights from Copenhagen and Stockholm, Frankfurt/Hahn, Tallinn and Riga to Tampere-Pirkkala International Airport.

Tampere Airport is served directly by five airlines: SAS, Blue 1, Finnair and Ryanair.

Please also notice that low fares airline Ryanair flies from Riga, Bremen, Frankfurt, and Hamburg to Tampere-Pikkala Airport. For the Ryanair flights timetable please visit: www.airpro.fi/ryanair\_lentoaikataulut.

The trip from Tampere-Pirkkala airport to Tampere city centre takes less than half an hour. The fastest way to reach the city centre is to take an Airport taxi, which takes travellers to all the city centre hotels. The fare is  $12 \in \text{per person}$ , whereas a normal taxi costs about  $20\text{-}30 \in .$

#### by bus

Travelling by an express coach is an easy way to get from the Helsinki-Vantaa Airport or Helsinki city centre to Tampere. The coach departs every 1-2 hours and the traveling time is approx. 2,5 hours (ticket approx. 20€). #### by train

There are train connections by comfortable trains between Helsinki and Tampere city centres. From the Helsinki-Vantaa airport you can easily take a bus to Helsinki or Tikkurila railway station and take a train from there. Trains depart every hour (except for night time), and the travelling time 1,5-2 hours (ticket approx. 26€). For further information please visit website: http://www.vr.fi/heo/eng/index.

#### **About Tampere**

Tampere is the third largest city in Finland and the largest inland centre in the Nordic countries. Currently there are over 200,000 inhabitants in Tampere, and almost 300,000 inhabitants in Tampere Sub-Region, which comprises Tampere and its neighbouring municipalities. Tampere is located at a distance of 173 kilometers northwest from Helsinki.

The city was founded in 1779 on the banks of Tammerkoski Rapids (one of Finland`s official national scenic areas). There are 200 lakes and ponds in Tampere, and a total of 450 in the entire region. 24 per cent of Tampere's surface area is water and 76 per cent land. 18.5 per cent of the land has a town plan.

In 2004, the City of Tampere came first in an image survey comparing the largest cities in Finland. It was also the most attractive city among Finns who plan on moving.
