
Asylum seekers to Norway

- 2015 was a record year: 31.145 asylum seekers
- Average year: app. 15.000 asylum seekers
- A majority is young men

People settled in Kristiansand


- Kristiansand: Twice as many as national average last 8 years
- Three times as many as Oslo and Stavanger
- In 2010. Voted as the best «settle-city» of the year

Number of asylum seekers to Norway last 30 years








Where did they come from to Norway in 2015? (31.145)

"Integration requires a preparedness on the part of the refugees to adapt to the host society, without having to forego their own cultural identity. From the host society, it requires communities that are welcoming and responsive to refugees, and public institutions that are able to meet the needs of a diverse population»

- Christian Intercultural work












Successful integration in Kristiansand?



69 % employment one year after finishing the introduction programme, 7 % unemployment

2010 – 2013: Reduction in the number of imigrants with no education or schooling

Employment rate has showed a downward trend in the period 2014 – 2015
